

K-3 Primary

In our primary grades, we are committed to developing foundational skills. Our boys learn fundamental skills through A Beka Book Curriculum. The A Beka Book Curriculum places an emphasis on Reading and Arithmetic. PGBA offers a small pupil to teacher ratio, which ensures that each student's needs are met. The maximum class size is 18 students; each class with 15 or more students has a full-time teacher assistant in addition to the classroom teacher. Our students are taught in self-contained classrooms where they are engaged and enriched through instruction that is designed to promote higher level thinking skills. The A Beka Book Curriculum targets the following:

- Bible
- Reading
- Phonics/Spelling
- Arithmetic
- Writing/Penmanship
- Language, Science, or History


- Bible
